Annual Public Meeting Highlights



Water Board echoes ONA - new provincial drought ratings aren't measuring up: OBWB will send an official letter to the province to address

concerns with the new drought rating system, echoing issues raised by the Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA). The ONA recently sent a letter to Honourable Randene Neill, Minister of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship (WLRS) outlining concerns regarding the disconnect between the province's assigned regional drought levels and on-the-ground conditions. OBWB staff have also been reporting this disconnect as the summer progressed—with the province's new method of regional drought rating indicating low or no drought conditions in the Okanagan despite a number of key creeks with concerningly low flows, and many utilities requiring advanced stage watering restrictions.

Development of potentially revolutionary invasive mussel detection tool proposed: Directors received a presentation from Dr. Michael Russello, Professor of Population and Conservation Genomics at UBCO, with a proposal to develop a rapid eDNA detection tool for zebra, quagga, and golden mussels. Developed in combination with University of California Davis and Queen's University, the tool would allow for detection results in minutes, with the analysis done in the field. The current gold



standard for field inspections is the use of mussel-detecting dogs that are limited in numbers and expensive to train/deploy. The final phase of the proposed project would test the new tool against the dogs. If the ability to detect invasive mussels is similar, this tool would provide an extremely economical and accessible method of inspection. Board Directors were very enthusiastic about the proposal and staff were directed to explore a potential partnership with UBCO and return to the Board with recommendations.



New invasive milfoil identification guide available to public: Directors heard about a new public education tool recently launched by OBWB staff to help Okanagan residents better identify invasive milfoil in Okanagan lakes. The visual identification guide includes photos of native aquatic plants for comparison, helping to reduce inaccurate public reports and allowing staff to prioritize verified sightings. The guide is available on the OBWB's six milfoil machines, and online through our website.

New milfoil harvester arrives - summer launch planned:

The OBWB's newest milfoil harvester, a custom-built 2025 Aquarium HM620, was delivered on Sept. 8, 2025. This unit replaces a machine from 1978 and offers significant improvements in efficiency and maneuverability, including a custom design that allows the machine to safely pass under the low-clearance bridge in



Osoyoos. With the 2025 harvesting wrapping, an official launch is planned for summer 2026.
